Welcome & Roll Call

Present: Directors Marquez (Hayward), Narum (Pleasanton), and Chair Hannon (Newark) **Excused:** Directors King (Piedmont) and Valle (Alameda County)

Public Comment

This item is reserved for persons wishing to address the Committee on any EBCE-related matters that are not otherwise on this meeting agenda. Public comments on matters listed on the agenda shall be heard at the time the matter is called. As with all public comment, members of the public who wish to address the Committee are customarily limited to three minutes per speaker and must complete an electronic speaker slip. The Board Chair may increase or decrease the time allotted to each speaker.

Jessica Tovar, speaking on behalf of the East Bay Clean Power Alliance, thanked the Board for the action that it has taken to address the backlog of pandemic-related utility debt. Jessica Tovar also spoke in support for increased investment in community-trusted resilience hubs, stating that frontline communities will rely on islandable solar battery storage to survive PG&G's planned power shut-offs. Jessica

Tovar stated that EBCE can assist grassroots organizations to implement islandable solar battery storage programs by locating outside funding sources and providing technical assistance.

Audrey Ichinose spoke in support for increased funding and support for the Community Solar Green Tariff Program ("CS-GT") and Community Banking initiative. Audrey Ichinose stated that EBCE should establish a specific budget for CS-GT, and that EBCE should sponsor adding solar to the Disadvantaged Community Green Tariff ("DAC-GT") program, so that these community solar sites can function as accessible community reliance centers for DAC residents in times of emergency. Audrey Ichinose also spoke in support of EBCE's Community Banking Initiative (Item 6), but stated that EBCE should consider a commitment to social equity and environmental goals in its selection criteria. A. Ichinose recommended Beneficial State Bank, an Oakland, CA-based Community Development Financial Institution, for EBCE's consideration.

Preview and discuss the current state of the Draft Budget

Barbara Stebbins spoke in support for programs that increase energy equity in EBCE's service territory. Barbara Stebbins stated that 60% of the Local Development Business Plan budget is devoted to electric vehicle development program, which predominantly benefits higher income customers. Barbara Stebbins asked which programs are included in Collaborative Procurement, noting that a number of

programs are listed there. Barbara Stebbins also asked if Community Investment includes the Community Innovation grant, and if there be funding for that grant this year. Barbara Stebbins asked for a definition of MAS resources and expressed concern that the Local Development Business Plan contains programs that do not belong there, such as Sponsorship and Events and Covid-19 Relief.

Beth Weinberger spoke in support of the comments, concerns and questions raised by Barbara Stebbins, specifically about community involvement and the equitable allocation of funds to benefit low-income communities.
