13. (1:11:14) CEO Report

CEO Howard Chang provided an update on various activities and developments within the organization. He highlighted discussions from recent subcommittee meetings, including resilience initiatives and fiscal updates, and introduced a new Director of Clean Energy Structured Finance. He detailed ongoing community grant programs, a Habitat for Humanity project supporting all-electric homes, the launch of a revamped website with city-specific resources, and outreach efforts through community events. Additionally, CEO Chang noted mid-year rate adjustments that reduced generation costs while pointing out significant increases in PG&E delivery rates.

(1:24:28) Public Comment: Jim Lutz shared his analysis of a decade's utility bills, noting that while Ava's generation rates have remained stable, total electricity costs have tripled since 2018.

14. (1:22:50) CAC Chair Report

Vice-Chair Souza reported that the CAC unanimously supported the hourly pricing pilot program. Vice-Chair Souza also stated that the CAC did not take a position on Proposition 4.

(1:28:43) Public Comment – Eric Brooks spoke in opposition to Proposition 4, stating that it lacks accountability and contains language in its wildfire and forest management

sections that could promote harmful logging practices.

15. Nuclear Allocation Decision (Action Item)

Consider Diablo Canyon Nuclear Allocation

CEO Howard Chang outlined the extension of the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant's operations to 2029/2030 and presented three scenarios for Ava Community Energy to consider: rejecting the nuclear allocation, accepting it with cost-saving adjustments, or using it to offset system power while achieving greater GHG reductions.

The **Board of Directors** engaged in a thorough discussion about whether to accept the nuclear allocation from Diablo Canyon.

Board members discussed:

- The potential for significant cost savings;
- Nuclear safety and waste disposal;
- Reductions in greenhouse gas emissions, and decreased reliance on fossil fuels, particularly benefiting frontline communities exposed to pollution from gas power plants;
- The potential delay in investments in local renewable energy;
- Nuclear power's role as a transitional solution to meet clean energy goals;
- The risk of undermining Ava's reputation as a leader in clean, renewable energy; public opposition;
- Alignment with PCIA charges already paid by customers;
- The need for transparency in the energy mix, and
- The broader environmental justice impacts on vulnerable communities.
